Years 7 -8 A Secure and Enjoyable Transition

Our Junior school program builds strong foundations for future success by emphasising literacy and numeracy and the use of learning technologies. Good study habits, regular homework and pride in achievement are encouraged, expected and rewarded.

Years 9 and 10 - Growth and Preparation

Academic learning is put into wider context with extensive course and careers counselling, a major community project and structured work experience. A rigorous and challenging curriculum enables students to make informed choices for VCE and beyond. Year 10 students are provided with opportunities for early commencement of VCE and acceleration of their studies.

Years 11 and 12 - Scholarship and Excellence

Academic rigour, a strong work ethic and culture of cooperation permeate Paisley's focus on the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) and vocational success for every Bayside student.

Paisley students are provided with extensive individual counselling resources that include advice on study skills, time management and course selection.

International Student Program

Bayside College is in the local government area of Hobson's Bay, located 15kms to the west of the centre of Melbourne City (20 minutes by public transport). Each campus can be easily accessed by buses and trains. The popular harbour town of Williamstown is nearby with its many restaurants, sporting and beach facilities.

Bayside College has three campuses. Each campus provides students with the advantage of a compact, nurturing environment, supported by all the curriculum benefits and physical resources of a large school.

There is a choice of two junior campuses, one located in Williamstown catering for students from years seven to nine and the other in Altona North catering for students prep to nine. Both prepare students for the challenges of the senior campus at Paisley catering for years ten through to twelve.

International students are warmly welcomed into the Bayside Community. Classroom teachers are aware of the learning needs of international students and support them in their studies.

To look after the academic success and welfare of our international students we provide:-

- An International Student Coordinator
- Airport transfers
- Homestay accommodation: we take great care in finding and monitoring suitable home stay families and make sure that our international students are happy and secure.
- English as a Second Language Classes: there are specialist ESL teachers. Class sizes are small and additional support is provided for individual students.
- Regular contact with an ESL aide to manage English skill development.
- Introduction to swim safety lesson
- Introduction to bike safety lesson
- Orientation to local areas, public transport
